EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

FCA Ministry

The Fellowship of Christian Athletes is a sports ministry founded in 1954 targeting athletes, students and coaches on high school, junior high and college campuses. FCA is the largest interdenominational, school-based, Christian sports organization in America. FCA uses the platform of athletics, with athletes and coaches as role models to reach the world that is influenced by sports with the Gospel of Jesus Christ. FCA serves the local communities through its “4 C’s” of ministry; Campus Ministry, Camp Ministry, Community Ministry and Coaches Ministry. FCA is a member of the Evangelical Council for Financial Accountability, an independent organization that represents the highest standard for financial accountability. FCA is proud to have one of the lowest ratios of administrative expenses to donations of any charitable organization. In fact, in 2007 approximately 90 cents of every dollar contributed goes towards the staff and program needs in the local area. In February of 2005 Les Steckel, was hired as the President of FCA. Les coached in the National Football League as a Head Coach for the Minnesota Vikings and an Assistant Coach for the Broncos, Titans, Buccaneers and Bills. Les is the author of “One Yard Short” a book which chronicles his life story and coaching career.

FCA Mission Statement

To present to coaches and athletes and all whom they influence, the challenge and adventure of receiving Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord, serving Him in their relationships and in the fellowship of the Church.

FCA National Ministry Goal

FCA’s goal is to have a presence on every school campus in America. In 2008, FCA had 7,125 certified Campus Huddles (college, high school and junior high/middle school) that impacted over 356,250 students and athletes. FCA also held 266 summer camps attended by over 46,000 coaches and athletes. Overall, FCA Huddles, Camps and Events reached over 2,000,000 people in 2008! As astounding as these numbers are the immediate fruit of these efforts were 33,994 commitments of faith and over 48,000 commitments to play Drug Free!

FCA Southern California Vision Statement

We seek to be a powerful movement of God in Southern California. We desire to establish a strong FCA presence in all nine counties by Knowing God, Working Together, Serving People, Developing Leaders and Proclaiming Jesus.

FCA Southern California Ministry Goal

The goal for the Southern California Region of FCA is to someday have a presence on every junior high, high school and college campus in the 9 counties from San Luis Obispo to San Diego. Currently, there are Huddles on 214 campuses with an estimated weekly attendance of over 6,000 students and athletes. The Summer Camp held at UC Santa Barbara was attended by 655 campers and 115 of them made first time commitments of faith!

FCA MINISTRY OVERVIEW

History and Description

FCA was founded in 1954 by Don McClanen and two years later held its first summer camp in Estes Park, Colorado with 256 athletes and coaches in attendance. For over 50 years FCA has been using athletics as a vehicle to guide young men and women in their understanding of God, His Word and Jesus Christ. FCA is a non-denominational, para-church ministry that emphasizes the foundation of God's Word as taught from the Bible. In FCA Huddle and Camp meetings, the focus is on the fundamentals of the Christian faith. FCA leaves subjects such as modes of baptism, charismatic gifts, and other denominational issues to the local church, which teaches these doctrines. When questions about these issues are raised within the FCA environment the students are referred to their church leaders for answers.

Just as Jesus Christ is the central focus of the Bible – He is also the central focus of FCA. No traditional or popular issue will replace the main focus of Christ and the salvation He offers through faith.

FCA meets young people where they are in their spiritual journey and moves them toward an understanding of God's Word and Jesus Christ. FCA understands there is a process that people must go through to understand and commit to the Gospel. This process takes time and involves influence from key relationships.

Since the first days of existence in 1954, FCA's most vital partner has been the Church. As a non-denominational ministry, FCA is not concerned with denominational labels. Instead, each Teammate is urged to attend and serve in the Church of his or her choice. In fact, FCA activities are regularly planned so as not to interfere with Church services.

Two of the unique features of FCA are its ability to work within the American education system and its focus on athletes and coaches. FCA has determined that the junior high, senior high and college campuses provide the best locations to reach athletes and coaches. One source states that 96% of Americans participate in or watch a sporting event every week. FCA has chosen the platform of athletics not only to reach athletes and coaches but also everyone who may be influenced by them. All students are regularly welcomed in all FCA Huddles, camps and events.

Just as volunteers launched FCA in the beginning they are essential to carrying out the plans of the ministry today. Volunteers are the backbone for Huddles, Camps, Adult Chapters, Leadership Boards and the financial base. At this high level of involvement volunteers provide the work force necessary to accomplish FCA's mission.

Ministry Structure

FCA's focus is on athletes and coaches at the junior high, high school and college level. From very humble beginnings, FCA has grown into the nation's largest para-church ministry with four main platforms through which it spreads the message of God's Word. These platforms are the Campus Ministry, the Camp Ministry, the Community Ministry and the Coaches Ministry.

Campus Ministry

The FCA Campus Ministry grew out of a desire to follow up with those athletes who experienced a life changing week at FCA camp. The main vehicle established and used for Campus Ministry is called a Huddle. A Huddle is a regular meeting led by students and facilitated by coaches or teachers where young people hear and learn about the Word of God through Bible studies and discussions. Often, college or professional athletes and coaches as well as local business people and parents will speak at Huddles to share their testimonies and life experiences. Huddles are open to all students: non-Christians as well as Christians. Most Huddles meet on campus once a week although some Huddles may meet at a local Church or in a home. All Huddles must be certified by the FCA through an internal registration process. Each year every Huddle receives a resource kit with Bible studies, games, and leadership training materials to assist them during the school year.

Another method used by FCA for Campus Ministry is the Team Bible Study. These are sport specific Bible studies led by coaches and athletes that meet on a regular basis. Typically, they will consist of players that desire to get together to study and read the Word of God with their teammates.

Finally, FCA hosts many school assemblies to build relationships with school administration and challenge students in critical areas such as drugs and alcohol, teenage dating and other important choices they make in life.

The Three Primary Goals of a Huddle

- 1. Fellowship.** The primary goal of the Huddle is to create a safe place where young people can learn about the Lord and build relationships with other students who share common interests. In addition, the Huddle provides a setting for each person to openly discuss their faith in God with their peers.
- 2. Growth.** Growth is developing a balanced Christian life that encourages a growing understanding and obedience to God's Word and Jesus Christ. Huddles encourage growth through student involvement in Huddle activities such as prayer, Bible readings and taking part in church youth activities.
- 3. Outreach.** Outreach is demonstrating by words and deeds to the world around us our relationship with Christ and our understanding of Christian principles. Huddles regularly are involved in community programs such as volunteering to work in Special Olympics, adopting

families through the Prison Fellowship Christmas Program, participating in community food drives for needy families and other community services.

The strength and health of a Huddle is dependent not only on coaches and student leaders but also on the support that the Huddle receives from FCA. Huddles that are regularly supported by an FCA staff person are larger and healthier than those that receive little or no support. Raising financial support to hire and maintain fulltime FCA staff remains one of the most critical roles in supporting Huddles. Two of the ways that FCA staff members start and support Huddles is by building solid relationships with the local coaches and student leaders of each Huddle as well as training and equipping them for campus ministry.

Camp Ministry

FCA began 50 years ago with one summer camp at Estes Park, Colorado. Over 250 high school athletes attended this first camp to train themselves physically and spiritually. In 2008, over 46,000 athletes attended FCA camps for the same opportunity. These camps are tremendous opportunities for young athletes to learn their sport and receive spiritual training from college and professional coaches and athletes. The camps provide an environment for students to learn about the Bible, God and His plan for them. With 50 years of camping experience FCA has extremely high quality staff. The FCA Summer Camp staff of over 2,500 has been carefully selected and consists of FCA staff, current and former collegiate and professional athletes and coaches. These individuals bring years of coaching and performance experience and serve as role models to students both on and off the field. Camps are funded not just by enrollment fees but also by donations from individuals, corporations and foundations. Each year many thousands of athletes attend an FCA camp through camp scholarships provided by donors.

Community Ministry

The strength of FCA in an area is directly related to the involvement of the community. FCA encourages community support through relationships with churches, local leadership boards and Special Events. FCA hosts many Special Events each year to promote the health and growth of the ministry on both the national and local levels. Nationally, these events serve to reach a broad audience with FCA's message and support local staff and huddles wherever they are held. Locally, these events are used as outreaches to the schools, Churches, individuals and businesses that makeup and support FCA in the community. These events are great opportunities to bring together coaches, athletes and students from around the region.

Coaches Ministry

FCA believes that coaches and teachers are the most influential people in America. Through their influence, we can give young people the support they need to make the right decisions in life. As a ministry, FCA recognizes the need to encourage and challenge coaches in the non-sport areas of their lives. In fact at the Coaches Weekend, FCA holds workshops for coaches and their spouses on Family Life, Faith Life and Financial Life. If a coach is healthy in these areas of their life then they will have an even greater influence on the lives of young people.

SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA FCA MINISTRY

History

In 1997 there were 10 huddles with approximately 200 kids in attendance in all of Southern California. In 1997 Donnie Dee, then the Colorado State Director, moved with his family to Oceanside to be the Southern California Regional Director. As Donnie progressed in building a support network in Southern California, full-time staff people were hired and the presence and impact of FCA began to grow. Today there are over 214 Huddles and Team Bible studies throughout Southern California with over 6,000 students in weekly attendance. Our goal is to have 274 Huddles established and operating by the end of the 2008-2009 school year.

Campus Ministry

The primary focus of FCA in Southern California is to support and expand our Campus Ministry program. With 1,200 total schools in the region FCA envisions a day when there will be a campus ministry program on each of those campuses.

In addition to weekly campus meetings Southern California FCA has several student leadership training events each year. These events are held at the beginning of the school year and in the Spring semester. Each event will have worship and a featured speaker to challenge the students in their walk with Christ and leadership role. Also, we will offer workshops such as: The Role of the Coach, The Role of the Student Athlete, What is a Healthy Huddle? Why Should You Go to Church? and How to Lead a Huddle Meeting. These training events are currently held in San Diego, Los Angeles and Orange Counties as these are the counties with the strongest presence.

Camp Ministry

Each year FCA hosts several camps with the largest being a week long Sports Camp at UC Santa Barbara offering over 20 different sports. In 2008 over 650 young athletes attended this Sports Camp which is divided into a boys' camp and a girls' camp. Each athlete is assigned to a Huddle led by a college athlete. . A typical day's schedule has the campers practicing twice a day and attending small group Bible studies. In the evening they attend assemblies to hear dynamic speakers and learn about Jesus Christ and how to grow their faith.

One of the responsibilities of the FCA staff and volunteers is to raise funds to send young athletes to camp that may not be able to afford it on their own. In 2008, FCA in Southern California provided \$180,000 in camp scholarships through donations from the community. Additionally, 115 campers made first-time decisions for Christ and hundreds of others made commitments to their faith.

Community Ministry

Southern California FCA hosts many events to both promote the ministry to the community and to raise funds for the ongoing needs of the ministry. As each FCA staff person is responsible for raising the amount of funds equal to their own salary these events play a significant role in the continued support and expansion of the ministry.

Bowl Breakfasts

The Bowl Breakfasts are two of the largest and highest profile events for FCA in Southern California. They are fund and awareness raising events planned around the Holiday Bowl and the Rose Bowl. Numerous players and coaches from the teams that participate in these bowl games attend the breakfasts along with local high school coaches, athletes, students and the business community. Traditionally, an athlete from each team along with a featured speaker will share an inspirational message at these Breakfasts. In 2008, former Buffalo Bills, Quarterback , Frank Reich spoke to over 750 at the San Diego Bowl Breakfast and Los Angeles Laker Guard, Derek Fisher spoke to over 700 at the Championship Breakfast in Los Angeles. The San Diego Bowl Breakfast is scheduled for December 30, 2008 and the Championship Breakfast has been replaced with a Spring Banquet to help promote the FCA Summer Camp.

The Night of Champions

Orange County FCA hosts The Night of Champions (NOC) each year for the Huddles in the county. The purpose is to bring together all the huddles in the County for a night of food, fellowship, fun, and outreach. The NOC is a place where our FCA leaders (kids and adults) are encouraged to walk deeper with the Lord and to use their influence for God on their campus. The NOC provides an atmosphere that is a "safe and cool" place to invite their non-Christian friends to introduce them to Jesus Christ. In 2008 there were approximately 800 that attended this annual event that was generously sponsored by In-N-Out Burgers.

Golf Tournaments

The FCA Golf Tournaments are fund raising events largely aimed at the business and golf communities. FCA is fortunate to host several tournaments throughout Southern California. These tournaments were held last year at The Crossings in San Diego County, El Niguel Country Club for Orange County and Las Verdes Golf Course for Los Angeles County. We also hosted our 2nd annual tournament in San Bernardino County at Shandin Hills. These events not only provide necessary finances but also increase the community's awareness and understanding of the role that FCA plays within their local area. Funds are raised through corporate and individual sponsorships, entry fees, raffles and auctions.

Golf Marathon

FCA's Golf Marathons are small events where golfers raise pledges and attempt to play 100 holes of golf in one day. Pledges are usually on a per hole basis and range from 25 cents to \$10 or more per hole. The Golf marathon requires approximately 10 hours to complete and the combination of difficulty along with a number of games between the players creates an atmosphere of fun and bonding for all involved. Currently, we host one Marathon in Southern California at Shadowridge Country Club every September.

Coaches Ministry

As our Campus Ministry grows it is critical that we recognize the needs of coaches and teachers. They have a difficult task of teaching young people and preparing them for life. The demands on coaches and teachers are greater than ever before and FCA desires to be a ministry that supports and encourages them. In Southern California we have two key events that we use to minister to coaches and their spouses.

Coaches Weekend

One of our most uplifting programs is the Coaches Weekend. This is a weekend retreat for Huddle coaches and their spouses. FCA provides couples a weekend to relax, spend time together and hear dynamic speakers, discuss family, faith and finances. Each year this event has a tremendous impact as coaches and their spouses share with us how they feel refreshed, relaxed and renewed in their marriage, faith and careers. This event is underwritten by donations and the cost to the participants is only sixty-nine dollars per couple. In 2008 we hosted the event at the Woodfin Suites in San Diego and over 30 couples attended. The 2009 Coaches Weekend is scheduled for March 27-28 at the Irvine Hilton in Orange County.

Legacy Builders Bible Studies

One of our newest programs for Coaches are small group bible studies that are called Legacy Builders. We are training coaches how to Coach God's Way and challenging them to leave a legacy not a memory. These weekly Bible Studies are coordinated by local staff and meet regularly for 12 sessions. They are school identified in that they meet in a classroom before school with other coaches from the same campus. Currently, there are 6 Legacy Builder Bible Studies.

Southern California Regional Staff

Regional Director: Donnie Dee

Donnie was raised in Kansas City, Missouri and Jackie grew up in Dallas, Texas.

Donnie and Jackie both graduated from the University of Tulsa in 1988, Donnie with a Business Management Degree and Jackie with a degree in Communications. They were married that same year and have two children, Johnny and Jennifer.

While at the University of Tulsa, Donnie was a four-year letterman in football and Jackie ran Cross Country. Donnie was selected in the 11th round of the NFL draft by the Indianapolis Colts and played 2 1/2 years of professional football.

They both became Christians through FCA at the University of Tulsa and spent seven years working for FCA in Colorado where Donnie was the State Director.

Donnie and Jackie make their home in Oceanside and attend North Coast Church in Vista

Assistant to the Regional Director: Leslie Kemp

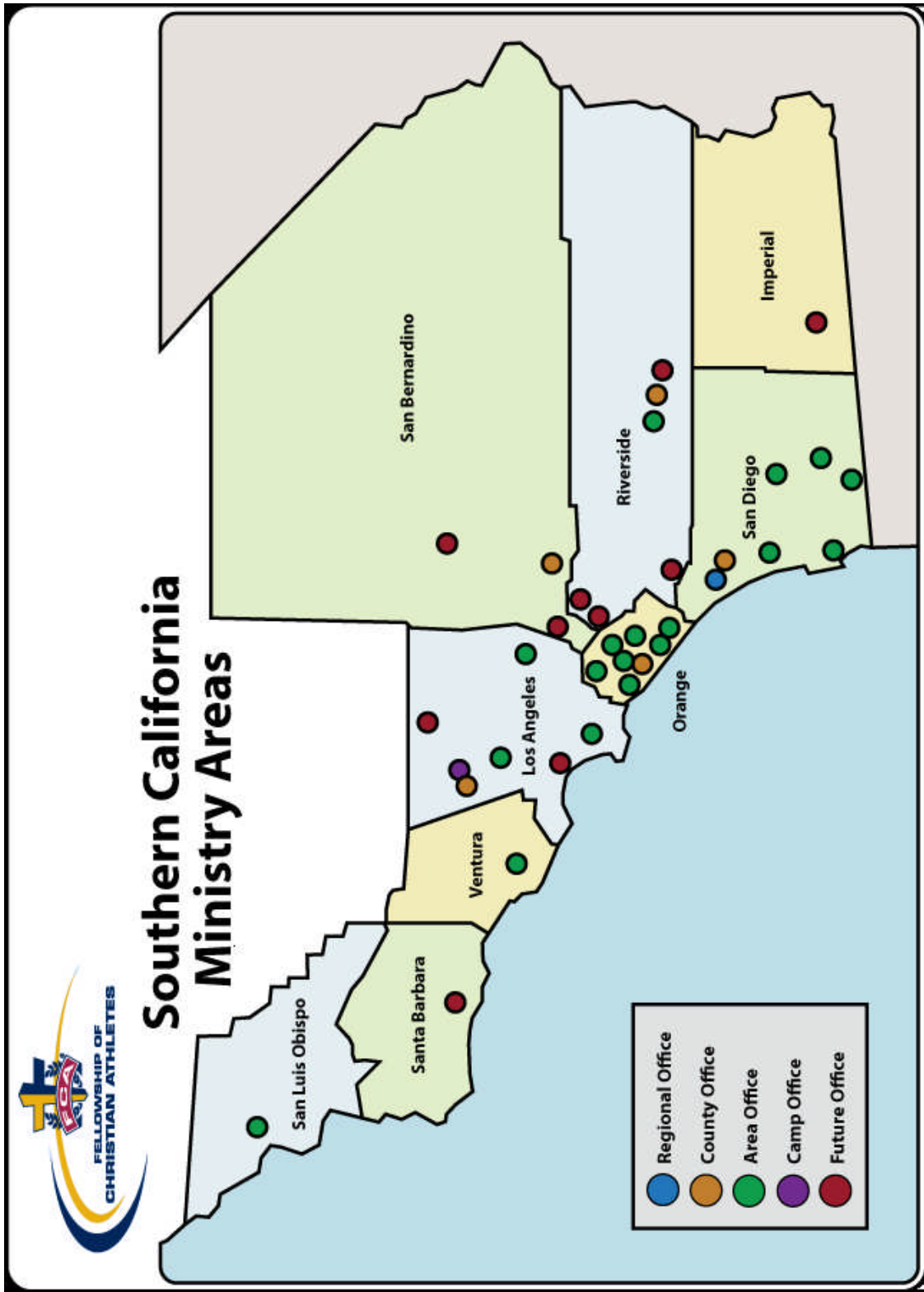

Southern California FCA Camp Ministry Overview

Southern California FCA Camp Ministry

History

For the past 50 years the FCA has hosted summer sports camps throughout the country. It was during the 1980's that the first FCA camp was offered in California. As FCA in Southern California has grown so have the needs of the camp ministry. To meet these needs Southern California FCA created a Regional Camp Office in 2001 to specifically plan and organize the Boys and Girls Sports camps. Debbie Haliday served as the Regional Camp Director for several years until resigning this past year. After our 2007 Summer Camp, Erin McGrath was promoted to Regional Camp Director from her position as the top assistant in the Camp Office for the previous two years.

The 2008 Summer Sports Camp was a tremendous success with respect to the number of campers, the scholarship dollars raised and decisions for the Lord. We have spent several months evaluating the purpose, vision and structure of our Camp Ministry and have made several significant organizational decisions to better maximize the opportunities for our Summer Sports Camp.

We will be relocating FCA Camp to UCLA the week of June 30 – July 4 2009
We have created a new Camp vision statement
We will dissolve the Camp Office and assign responsibilities to the County Directors

Vision Statement

To create a camp experience were we improve athletically, connect relationally and encounter Jesus Christ powerfully.

San Diego County FCA

History

In 1997 Donnie Dee, then the Colorado State Director moved with his family to Oceanside to be the Southern California Regional Director. As fulltime staff people were hired, the presence and impact of FCA in San Diego began to grow. Today we have staff in the five geographical areas of San Diego County: San Diego Coastal, East County, South Bay, San Diego City, and North County Inland. We provide direction and training for 65 schools that offer the FCA programs.

Orange County FCA

History

In September of 1998, Mark Boyer became Orange County Director. Mark came into the position with some experience with FCA as a volunteer speaker at huddles and camps for many years through his involvement with Donnie Dee and as a professional athlete in Indiana. Having seen the impact of FCA in other parts of the country, Mark and his wife, Janna, felt the desire to be a part of the team growing the ministry in their native home of Southern California and in particular, Orange County.

From humble beginnings and since 1998, FCA has grown to have a presence on over 40 campuses, reaching more than 1,200 students per week.
