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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

FCA Ministry

The Fellowship of Christian Athletes is a sports ministry founded in 1954 targeting students, athletes, and coaches at the junior high through professional levels. FCA uses the platform of athletics, with athletes and coaches as role models to reach a world that is influenced by sports. FCA presents the Gospel of Jesus Christ through the 4 C's of the FCA ministry: Coaches ministry, Campus ministry, Camp ministry and the Community ministry. FCA is a member of the Evangelical Council for Financial Accountability, an independent organization that represents the highest standard for financial accountability. FCA is proud to have one of the lowest ratios of administrative expenses to donations of any charitable organization. In fact, approximately 91 cents of each dollar contributed to FCA is used directly in the region to which it is donated.

FCA Mission Statement

To present to coaches and athletes and all whom they influence, the challenge and adventure of receiving Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord, serving Him in their relationships and in the fellowship of the Church

National Ministry Goal

FCA's goal is to have a presence on every school campus in America. Currently, FCA has a presence on over 7,125 school campuses reaching nearly 356,250 students and coaches through these campus clubs..

Orange County Vision Statement

To have a presence on every available Junior High, High School and College campus; equipping, training and encouraging students, and adult leaders to stand firm in Christ and to reach out to their friends.

Orange County Ministry Goal

In Orange County, FCA has a vision to someday have a presence on every junior high, high school and college campus, which includes over 175 schools. Currently, FCA has a presence on 54 Orange County campuses with an estimated 2,000 students involved in these groups each week.

FCA MINISTRY OVERVIEW

History and Description

FCA was founded in 1954 by Don McClanen and two years later held its first summer camp in Estes Park Colorado with 256 athletes and coaches in attendance. For the past 53 years FCA has been using athletics as a vehicle to guide young men and women in their understanding of God, His Word and Jesus Christ. FCA is a non-denominational, para-church ministry that emphasizes the foundation of God's Word as taught from the Bible. In FCA Huddle meetings the focus is on the fundamentals of the Christian faith. FCA leaves subjects such as modes of baptism, charismatic gifts, and other denominational issues to the local church, which teaches these doctrines. When questions about these issues are raised within the FCA environment the students are referred to their church leaders for answers.

Just as Jesus Christ is the central focus of the Bible – He is also the central focus of FCA. No traditional or popular issue will replace the main focus of Christ and the salvation He offers through faith.

FCA meets young people where they are in their spiritual journey and moves them toward an understanding of God's Word and Jesus Christ. FCA understands there is a process that people must go through to understand and commit to the Gospel. This process takes time and involves influence from key relationships.

Since the first days of existence in 1954 FCA's most vital partner has been the Church. As a non-denominational ministry FCA is not concerned with denominational labels. Instead, each Teammate is urged to attend and serve in the Church of his or her choice. In fact, FCA activities are regularly planned so as not to interfere with Church services.

Two of the unique features of FCA are its ability to work within the American education system and its focus on athletes and coaches. FCA has determined that the junior high, senior high and college campuses provide the best locations to reach athletes and coaches. One source states that 96% of Americans participate in or watch a sporting event every week. FCA has chosen the platform of athletics not only to reach athletes and coaches but also everyone who may be influenced by them. All students are regularly welcomed in all FCA Huddles, camps and events.

Just as volunteers launched FCA in the beginning they are essential to carrying out the plans of the ministry today. Volunteers are the backbone for Huddles, Camps, Adult Chapters, Leadership Boards and the financial base. At this high level of involvement volunteers provide the work force necessary to accomplish FCA's mission.

Ministry Structure

FCA's focus is on athletes and coaches at the junior high, senior high and college level. From very humble beginnings FCA has grown into the nation's largest para-church ministry with four main platforms through which it spreads the message of God's Word. These platforms are Coaches ministry, Campus ministry, Camp ministry and the Community ministry.

Campus Ministry

The FCA Campus ministry grew out of a desire to follow up with those athletes who had a life changing week at FCA camp. A Huddle is a regular meeting led by students and facilitated by coaches or teachers where young people hear and learn about the Word of God through Bible studies and discussions. Often, college or professional athletes and coaches as well as local business people and parents will speak at Huddles to share their testimonies and life experiences. Huddles are open to all students: non-Christians as well as Christians. Most Huddles meet on campus once a week although some Huddles actually meet at local Churches. All Huddles must be sanctioned by the FCA through an internal registration process. Each year every Huddle receives a resource kit with Bible studies, games, and leadership training materials to assist them during the school year. One other aspect of the Campus ministry is a Team Bible Study. These are sport specific bible studies led by coaches and athletes that meet on a regular basis.

The Three Primary Goals of a Huddle

- 1. Fellowship.** The primary goal of the Huddle is to create a safe place where young people can learn about the Lord and build relationships with other students who share common interests. In addition, the Huddle provides a setting for each person to openly discuss their faith in Christ with their peers.
- 2. Growth.** Growth is developing a balanced Christian life that encourages a growing understanding and obedience to God's Word and Jesus Christ. Huddles encourage growth through student involvement in Huddle activities such as prayer, Bible readings and taking part in Church youth activities.
- 3. Outreach.** Outreach is demonstrating by words and deeds to the world around us our relationship with Christ and our understanding of Christian principles. Huddles regularly are involved in community programs such as volunteering to work in Special Olympics, adopting families through the Prison Fellowship Christmas Program, participating in community food drives for needy families and other community services.

The strength of the Huddle is dependent not only on coaches, teachers, and student leaders but also largely on the support that the Huddle can receive from FCA. Huddles that are regularly supported by an FCA staff person are larger and healthier than those that receive little or no support. Raising financial support to hire and maintain fulltime FCA staff remains one of the most critical roles in supporting Huddles. Two of the ways that FCA Staff start and support

Huddles are by building solid relationships with the local coaches and student leaders of each Huddle as well as training and equipping them for campus ministry.

Camp Ministry

FCA began 50 years ago with a Camp at Estes Park, Colorado. Over 250 high school athletes attended this camp to train themselves physically and spiritually. For the past 5 decades FCA has hosted summer camps for athletes and coaches. These camps are tremendous opportunities for young athletes to learn their sport and receive spiritual training from college and professional coaches and athletes. The camps provide an environment for students to learn about the Bible, God and His plan for them in a non-threatening manner. With 50 years of camping experience FCA has extremely high quality staff. Our 1,000-plus instructional staff has been carefully selected and consists of FCA staff, current and former collegiate and professional athletes and coaches. These individuals bring years of coaching and performance experience and serve as role models to students both on and off the field. Camps are funded not just by enrollment fees but also by donations from individuals, corporations and foundations. Each year thousands of students attend an FCA camp through camp scholarships provided by donors.

Community Ministry

The strength of FCA in an area is directly related to the involvement of the community. FCA encourages community support through relationships with churches, local leadership boards, and special events. FCA hosts many Special Events each year to promote the health and growth of the ministry on both the national and local levels. Nationally, these events serve to reach a broad audience with FCA's message and support local staff and Huddles wherever they are held. Locally, these events are used as outreaches to the schools, Churches, individuals and businesses that makeup and support FCA in the community. These events serve as great opportunities to bring together coaches, athletes, and students from around the county.

Coaches Ministry

The FCA believes that coaches and teachers are the most influential people in America. Through their influence we can give young people the support they need to make the right decisions in life. As a ministry, FCA recognizes the need to encourage and challenge coaches in the non-sport areas of their lives such as their family life, faith life, and financial life. If a coach is healthy in these areas of their life then they will have an even greater influence on the lives of young people.

ORANGE COUNTY FCA MINISTRY

History

Prior to 1998, there had not been any FCA staff in Orange County since 1994. There were 5 Huddles in the county at the time, which received little support from FCA in Kansas City. In 1998, Mark Boyer became the Orange County Director with the vision and desire to build the presence of FCA in the county. Mark had seen the influence of FCA in other parts of the country as he traveled as a professional football player. His hope was to see the same FCA impact in his native home of Orange County. As Mark progressed in building a support network for FCA in Orange County, full-time staff people were hired and the presence and impact of FCA began to grow.

Campus Ministry

In 1998 there were five huddles with approximately 75 kids in attendance. Currently, in September of 2008, there are 54 huddles in Orange County with nearly 2000 students in attendance on a bi-weekly basis. FCA's goal is to have 61 Huddles established and operating by the end of the 2008-2009 school year. Leadership's primary focus in Orange County is to support and expand the Campus Ministry program. With 175 total schools in the county, FCA envisions a day when there will be a campus ministry program on each of those campuses. As a "presenting" ministry, FCA is focused on encouraging and equipping the coaches and student leaders to reach out to their campus and not to just create another "Christian Club." FCA desires the huddles to be a safe place where non-Christian kids can be exposed to the Gospel and where Christian kids can work and plan to live out their faith on campus. Each FCA staff person is committed to providing training for these campuses and their leaders so that this model is duplicated on campuses around the county.

Orange County FCA has one student leadership training event each year in the fall. This event is designed to equip student leaders for campus ministry. Leadership training is focused on teambuilding and the basics of how to do campus ministry and, especially, how to attract non-Christians to the huddles. Training is held at Calvary Laguna. Each year, FCA also teams with staff members from Young Life in this training so that there is unity in reaching campuses for Christ.

Camp Ministry

Each year FCA hosts a week long sports camp at UC Santa Barbara with close to 700 student athletes attending this past year. The camp is divided into a Boys' camp and a Girls' camp with over 20 different sports offered. Each athlete is assigned to a Huddle led by a college athlete. A typical day's schedule has the campers practicing twice a day to improve their athletic skills, and attending small group Bible studies. In the evening they attend assemblies to hear dynamic speakers and learn about Jesus Christ and how to grow their faith. One of the responsibilities of the FCA staff and volunteers is to raise funds to send young athletes to camp that may not be able to afford it on their own. In July 2007, FCA provided over \$104,000 in camp scholarships and 401 campers made first-time decisions or re-dedicated their lives for Christ.

Community Ministry

Orange County FCA hosts several key events to promote the ministry to the community and to raise funds for the ongoing demands of the ministry. As each of the staff is responsible to both promote the ministry and to raise funds for their financial support, it is important that our events focus on accomplishing goals for both support and expansion of the ministry.

The OC Night of Champions

Since 1999, Orange County FCA has been hosting this community event which has attracted and impacted thousands of people over the years. Originally designed to be a place where the Huddles from various schools could meet once a year for “food, fun and fellowship,” the Night of Champions has now become a much anticipated event for both the Huddles and the greater community as well. Annually, people are treated to free In-N-Out Burgers, break dance competitions, comedy, exceptional and inspiring music, and great testimonies from peers and prominent Christian athletes who play for Christ at the college and professional levels. The goal and desire with the Night of Champions is to provide a “free, fun and cool” event where our Huddles and others can feel comfortable inviting their non-Christian friends. It truly is an outreach event. As hundreds of people over the years have become Christians or rededicated their lives to Christ at this event, Orange County FCA has found it important to assure these kids get plugged into a local church for discipleship. Thus, we work closely with local youth pastors and representatives of other para-church ministries like Young Life, to make sure this goal is accomplished. Because the Night of Champions is a free event for those who attend, funds are raised through local churches and individuals to host the event. The In-N-Out Burger company has been a real blessing over the years to make it a great event for Orange County FCA.

FCA Orange County Golf Events

FCA Golf Tournament

The FCA Golf Tournament is a fund raising event aimed at the business community. Orange County FCA has hosted this event since annually since 1999 and has been fortunate to host the past three tournaments at El Niguel Country Club. This event not only provides necessary finances but also increases the business community’s awareness and understanding of the role that FCA plays within their local community. Funds are raised through corporate and individual sponsorships, entry fees, raffles, and auctions.

The Ryder Cup – OC vs. LA, San Diego & Riverside

Each year, 12 golfers from Orange County compete head-to-head against 12 golfers from Los Angeles, San Diego and Riverside in an annual Ryder Cup event. This is a three day competition held in the desert of Palm Springs where players compete on some of the most exclusive golf courses in the state for bragging rights and in support of FCA. This event is an excellent fundraiser and also a great way to get more people from the business community

involved in Orange County FCA for ongoing support via finances, board membership and networking.

The Fall Golf Classic – “SC Against the World”

The Fall Golf Classic started out in 1999 as a typical Golf Marathon where golfers were solicited to play 100 holes of golf in a day in an effort to support the ministry financially. Over the years, however, through the advice and prodding of the board, the event has evolved into a more competitive tournament where 40 golfers pay a fee in order to compete in a “match play” tournament around the rivalry of the “SC vs. The World.” The idea of the event is to tap into the deep alumni base of USC and other schools in Orange County and to have a golf event that is both unique and fun which can also be used to raise funds and introduce more people to Christ. The Fall Golf Classic is an excellent fund raiser for Orange County FCA.

Coaches Ministry

As our Campus Ministry grows it is critical that we recognize the needs of coaches and teachers. They have a difficult task of teaching young people and preparing them for life. The demands on coaches and teachers are greater than ever before and Orange County FCA wants to be a ministry that supports and encourages them. We have two key events in Orange County for Coaches ministry:

Coaches Weekend

One of the most rewarding programs is the Coaches Weekend. This is a weekend retreat for Huddle coaches and their spouses. FCA provides couples a weekend where they will be able to relax, spend time together, listen to nationally renowned speakers, and attend marriage workshops. Each year this event has a tremendous impact as coaches and their spouses share with us how they feel refreshed, relaxed and renewed in their marriage. This event is underwritten by donations and the cost to the participants is only fifty dollars per couple. The 2009 Coaches Enrichment weekend will be held in March.

“Adopt a Huddle” Program

The “Adopt a Huddle” Program is designed to encourage the coaches who lead the Huddles in Orange County. Orange County FCA understands that these coaches have many demands upon their time and make an extra effort to establish and run the Huddle at their school. Under this program the Leadership Board and Committee members make phone calls, send post cards and set up meetings just to support and pray for the coaches and let them know how much they are appreciated for what they are doing.

Staff Biographies

Orange County Director: Mark Boyer

Mark is 46 years old and married to Janna for 25 years. They have five children, plus a new son-in-law. He is a graduate from USC with a business degree. Mark played football in NFL for eight years with the Colts and Jets. The Boyer's live in Huntington Beach.

Barry is 52 years old and married to Linda. They have four children. He is a graduate of Azusa Pacific University with degree in theology. Barry has been in youth ministry for over 28 years. Martinez's live in Huntington Beach.

Jeremy is 33 years old and married to Jami. Currently he serves FCA in North Orange County. He graduated from Southeastern Technical Institute with a degree in Mechanical Engineering and also has a bachelor's degree from Southwestern Assemblies of God University in Professional Development. Newport/Mesa Area Representative: Marina Mayer

Marina is 23 years old and is a graduate of USC where she played waterpolo for the Trojans. Marina grew up in Irvine, CA and played soccer, swimming and waterpolo as a youngster. She pursued her waterpolo career at USC, where she graduated in May 2007 with a Bachelors Degree in English.

Urban/Central Area Representative: Tony Gomez

Tony is 31 years old and is a graduate of Vanguard University with degree in Biblical Studies. He has worked as a coach and volunteer in wrestling and was a national championship wrestler in high school. He was very active with FCA camps prior to becoming intern. Tony lives in Santa Ana.

Huntington Valley Area Co-Representative: Jessica Goodman

Jessica is 23 years old and recently married to Adam Goodman. She is a 2006 graduate of Long Beach State where she received a degree in business administration. She was very active as an FCA leader at Edison High School and active participant of FCA camps. Jessica is the oldest daughter of Mark and Janna Boyer and lives with Adam in Huntington Beach. Jessica serves on staff helping with administrative duties and also huddles in the Huntington Beach area.

Huntington Valley Area Co-Representative: Megan Sadler

Megan is 23 years old and is a graduate of North Carolina State where she earned her Bachelors Degree in Parks, Recreation and Sport Management with a minor in Coaching

Education. Megan grew up in Virginia Beach, VA. She played college soccer at Megan was very involved with FCA and AIA in college. Megan lives in Newport Beach and is roommates with Marina Mayer, our OC FCA Newport Mesa Area Rep. Megan is our new staff person for the Huntington Beach and Fountain Valley area.

Irvine Valley Area Representative: Jared Hall

Leadership Board

The Advisory Board is made up of Business and Sports professionals who work closely with the Director of Orange County, Mark Boyer, and are focused on the strategic planning of the ministry and to assure the financial stability and viability of FCA in the county. The Leadership Board on the other hand is comprised of business people, parents and local volunteers who support more the local ministry aspects of FCA, including huddles and special events. The Leadership Board works directly with the OC Director of Ministries, Barry Martinez, to support the huddles, host events, raise funds through home team and assist with summer camps.

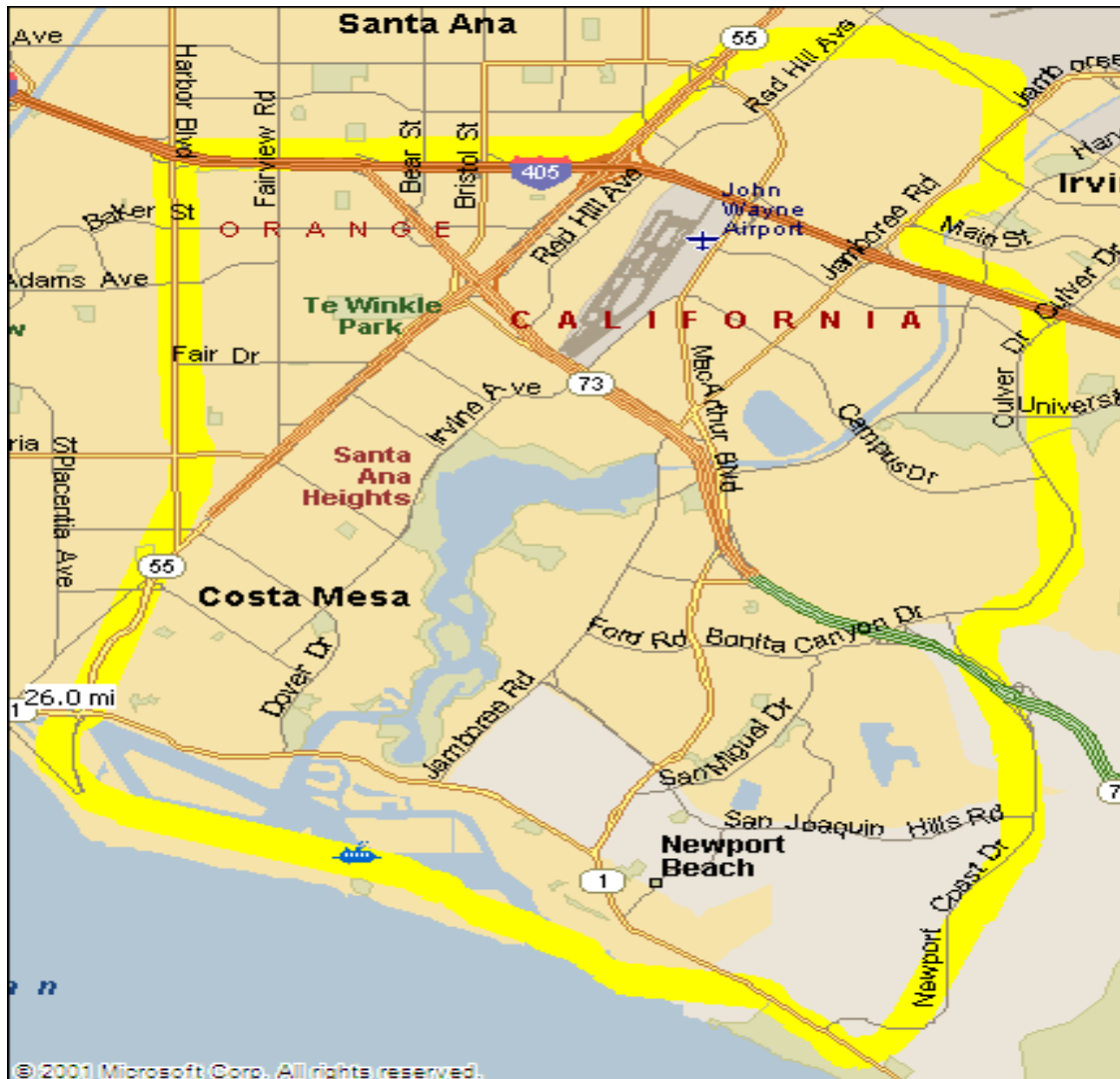
